Learning Objectives

Introduction

Sex and Relationships Education often involves dealing with difficult and sensitive issues. Please refer to your school policy document for further guidance. You may also want to invite the school nurse into school at this point for a more in-depth look at aspects such as menstruation and sexual relationships.

 Explain to the pupils that this session is designed to ensure that they understand that everybody changes at different rates and to help them be aware of changes and how these can make them both look and feel. This session will also help them to think about ways they can cope with these changes.
